NEW! RSVP to Staff Trainings in Cityspan

If you receive a Professional Development invitation or a Professional Development recommendation from your Program Specialist, you are required to RSVP in Cityspan for payroll purposes. This helps After School Matters issue complete and accurate payroll, and view which instructors have attended Professional Development.

How do I RSVP to a Professional Development event in Cityspan?

CPR Certification Information

After School Matters accepts valid CPR certificates from the American Red Cross and the American Heart Association. Please upload your certificate in the “Staff Experience” tab of your FY18 Contract. Instructors with a current, valid certification card from the American Red Cross or American Heart Association do not need to complete additional training. If you are a Spring 2017 After School Matters instructor who does not have a valid certificate from American Red Cross or American Heart Association, you are required to attend a CPR/AED/First Aid training with After School

In his program, teens work hands-on with video equipment and music recording software while gaining insight into the music industry as a career. Additionally, teens are able to produce music, short films, and write songs that are reflective of themselves and their communities. Sgt. Allen continues to build strong, long-lasting relationships with teens and is currently helping to expand the partnership between Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy (CAPS) and After School Matters. Instructional Strategy of the Month

PIES Check-in and Check-out

This method is used by Youth Guidance as well as BuildInc. (among others) and is in practice in several After School Matters programs.

Circle up with teens at the beginning of program. Using a talking piece, announce that each person will be sharing how they're doing **Physically, Intellectually, Emotionally, and Spiritually (PIES)**. Ask the group to define each of those terms, using the talking piece. Then, ask who would like to start. (Don't be afraid to wait for a volunteer.) If no one volunteers, you can volunteer to start. Make sure everyone, including you, shares by passing the talking piece.

Repeat this activity at the end of the day.
